KELSEY BLOCK

Compare the taller building at 45 N. Main St. and this building. The Kelsey building is the oldest building on Main St., built in 1854. What are some ways these buildings are different?



{5} East side of N. Main St.

The **Riviera** wasn't the only theater in town. Look up at the buildings on this side of the street and find the only building with no second story windows where a marquee sign for the old **Rex** and then the **Rialto Theater** once hung. What is the name of the store now at this location?



{6} East Alley

Look at the painting on the wall to your left showing the **Civil War Monument** that used to be in the middle of the street. Have you seen this monument in its new location in a nearby city park named for one of the first families?

In the painting you'll notice the sidewalks weren't concrete. What do you think they were made out of back then?



{7} Look across the street. You'll notice some buildings have a flat roof and some have fancy windows and a sloped roof. This design is called a "mansard roof." Do you think these buildings are newer or older?

Keep looking at the second floors – many buildings have the name of the original builder and the year they were finished.
