Great Read Alouds for Autism Awareness Month



Choldenko, Gennifer. *Al Capone Does My Shirts.* Twelve-year-old Moose Fannagan moves into Alcatraz Island in 1935 with other prison guard families, and has to cope with an environment that complicates the family routines

that help his autistic sister.



Davis, Mandy. *Superstar*. After years of homeschooling, mildly autistic fifth-grader Lester struggles to adapt and manage symptoms in a public school classroom. Then he enters the science fair, and discovers an unexpected truth

along the way.



Kapit, Sarah. **Get a Grip, Vivy Cohen!** Eleven-year-old knuckleball pitcher Vivy Cohen, who has autism, becomes pen pals with her favorite Major League baseball player after writing a letter to him as an assignment

for her social skills class.



Lord, Cynthia. *Rules.* Frustrated at life with an autistic brother, 12-year-old Catherine longs for a normal existence but her world is further complicated by a friendship with a young paraplegic.



Martin, Ann. Rain Reign.

Struggling with Asperger's, Rose shares a bond with her beloved dog, but when the dog goes missing in a storm, Rose challenges her comfort levels, abandoning her routines in order to search for her pet.



McNicoll, Elle.

A Kind of Spark. When she discovers that her small Scottish town used to burn witches simply because they were different, a neurodivergent girl who sees and hears things others cannot,

refuses to let them be forgotten.



Myers, Alison. A Bird Will Soar.

After a tornado, Axel, who loves birds, finds an injured eaglet, and helps to rescue it--and also helps to resolve the problems in his broken family, drawing his father back home.



Rudolph, Shaina. *All My Stripes.*

Zane the zebra feels different from the rest of his classmates. He worries that all they notice about him is his "autism stripe." With the help of his Mama, Zane comes to appreciate all

his stripes, the unique strengths that make him who he is!
